## **Fire Station #1:** Commissioner Lewis reported on the following:

- The new Detex exit alarm has been installed on the rear double doors of the banquet hall. I have been playing phone tag with Tommy from Steel City Locksmith to have the new cylinder installed in it, along with dropping off the master keys for Kyle, Drew and Jill.
- After receiving a much lower quote from the second request from Southtowns AV, the new truck room tv's have been installed and are working to display the IAR App. The members have commented on how much these operating displays help.
- As I have been away from home the majority of July and 6 days in August, I will contact Bob Harms again regarding the sidewalk cracks to set a day to meet.

## **Fire Station #2:** Commissioner Brodnicki reported on the following:

- The air conditioning drain was unplugged outside the lady's lavatory. Problem is now fixed.
- Received one quote to remove the trees on the side of the parking lot. He will get another quotation.

**Sale of Surplus Riding Mower – Status Report:** Commissioner Lewis advised he is trying to determine an appropriate value of the mower and advised some of the members are interested in the unit.

He will ask for sealed bids once the approximate value is determined.

Commissioner Brodnicki was requested to get cost estimates and to determine how the circuitry is laid out.
